



MAŁGORZATA MEGER

On 14 August 1947 in Bydgoszcz, the investigative judge of the District Court in Bydgoszcz with its seat in Bydgoszcz, in the person of Judge K. Dobrzański, with the participation of a reporter, trainee judge Pacanowski, interviewed the person specified below as a witness. Having been advised of the criminal liability for making false declarations, the witness testified as follows:

The witness testifies: I was detained in the concentration camp in Ravensbrück from 31 May 1942 until the end of the war. I was in block 17 and others. During that time, until October 1943, the position of *Oberaufseherin* [head overseer] was held by a German woman, Maria Mandl. She had a brutal and sadistic nature. This brutality manifested itself mainly in constant verbal abuse and frequent tormenting of the prisoners which involved beating and kicking them.

I witnessed this abuse, although she never hit me personally.

I cannot give the names of the victims abused by Maria Mandl.



The suspect's behavior stood out among other German functionaries of the camp in a negative way.

In October 1943, I think, the suspect was transferred to the camp in Auschwitz.

The report was read out before signing and concluded.
